



GATORS GIVE BACK

The Annual Dickinson ISD Stuff the Bus Food Drive was a huge success! Students, staff and parents all got into the holiday spirit and gave very generously to donate to the M.I. Lewis Food Pantry. Preliminary totals show the district collected approximately 30,000 food items, plus approximately \$11,000. This was the first year the district accepted monetary donations district-wide. The additional \$10,000 will go a long way toward

helping us provide food for those in need. Because of our relationship with the Houston Food Bank, we will be able to purchase between \$75,000 - \$100,000 worth of food, including perishable items like meat, which could not be donated in a normal food drive. The results were far beyond our expectations. Dickinson ISD campuses have a friendly competition each year to see who can bring in the most donations and this year, Dunbar Middle School came in first place, followed by Hughes Road Elementary in second place. Special thanks also goes out to the Dickinson High School Air Force Junior ROTC along with the district's Administration Building staff, who collected the food and delivered to our storage facility.
