

F.A.Q SNAP GAP RELIEF



Why is this happening?

Because of the federal government shutdown, SNAP (food stamp) benefits have been temporarily halted for November.

This means many Texans — including families in Galveston County — will not receive their usual benefits this month.

What help is M.I. Lewis offering right now? We have two different programs available:

SNAP GAP Assistance – Weekly food support for households in the Dickinson ISD area who are missing their November SNAP benefits.

Regular Food Pantry – Monthly grocery assistance for anyone living in Galveston County.

Who qualifies for each program?

SNAP GAP:

- Must live within Dickinson ISD boundaries
- Must be missing November SNAP benefits

Food Pantry:

• Must live anywhere in Galveston County

What do I need to bring?

SNAP GAP:

- Photo ID
- Proof of delayed or missing November SNAP benefits (screenshot from YourTexasBenefits.com, etc.)

Food Pantry:

- No documents required
- IDs for household members are encouraged so we can provide food based on household size

What will I receive?

SNAP GAP:

A supplemental food bag once per week while SNAP benefits are paused. Bags include pantry staples and shelf-stable items.

Food Pantry:

A grocery selection once per month based on household size and available inventory.



F.A.Q SNAP GAP RELIEF



How often can I come?

SNAP GAP: Once per week on Thursdays (2–5 PM) while benefits remain paused and supplies last. Food Pantry: Once per month (Tuesday–Friday, 8:30 AM–12:45 PM).

How long will these programs last?

SNAP GAP: Until SNAP benefits resume or resources run out.

Food Pantry: Available year-round, even when SNAP benefits are active again.

I'm already a M.I. Lewis client, can I still get help?

Yes. If you're missing your November SNAP benefits, you can receive SNAP GAP weekly assistance in addition to your regular monthly pantry visit.

I don't get SNAP benefits. Can I still get food?

Yes! If you live in Galveston County, you can receive help through our regular Food Pantry program.
